– to have so much work that you have problems dealing with it all.



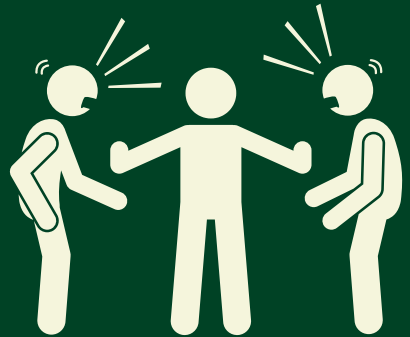
TO GET WIND OF SOMETHING
